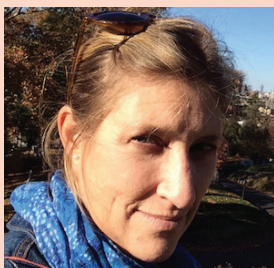
Pension, Budget & Tax
